Student Leadership Program Summary

This tutorial is designed for eligible 7th and 8th grade middle school students aspiring to participate in the Student Leadership Program that offers positions such as office workers, teacher's assistants, library assistants, and peer tutors as their elective. Once screened for eligibility, students then will complete the tutorial (initial training) to understand the importance of leadership and the rigorous expectations of the program.

Student objectives:

- (1) Explain what it means to be a good leader and list their tasks, expectations, and grading criteria.
- (2) Review the nine essential character traits expected from a good leader.
- (3) Be prepared with an idea for their mandatory service-learning project.
- (4) Independently follow directions, practice taking notes while reading, review information from an interactive tutorial, and seek help if they need clarification.

The student will be assessed using a quiz that provides a feedback summary for error analysis. The tutorial's interactivity and self-paced nature will help students independently learn or review information. The quiz summary will help the student as well as the program supervisor examine and evaluate areas that need further clarification or teaching.

Once the tutorial is developed and implemented, it will run at minimal cost, while the old method of direct teaching required between 30 minutes – 1 hour of the program supervisor's time per student.



Answer: She will be placed on probation for four weeks, assigned to a review tutorial and study island assignments, and parent(s) will be notified. If her grades don't improve by week 5, she will be dropped from the program.

Nick had a bad morning at home. Later in the day he was rude to his Reading teacher who assigned him detention for his disrespectful attitude. What will happen to his leadership position as peer tutor?

Answer: He will be expected to seek one-on-one counseling, practice open communication with his Reading teacher, and repair his relationship with her. His position will not be directly effected.
